- **News from the Daylight Centre in Wellingborough** The homeless shelter on the Embankment will not be opening this year. Social distancing and the fact that most of those who have used it are now "housed homeless" means it is not required over this coming winter. There are still some street sleepers but not so many now that they have been housed in hotels and lodgings by the Council because of the pandemic. From last week the Daylight Centre is now making available hot meals each day for the homeless and the 'housed homeless', these can be collected from the Centre at a specific time. The meals are provided using resources from the Food Bank, as well as Daylight Centre funds. If you would like to support the Food Bank, which now provides food parcels for the 'housed homeless' as well as those families who have met with adversity, please deliver any donations to 2 Manchester Road, Wollaston or contact Jean & David Rose 01933 663778 to arrange collection. Stocks are now running low on: Jellies, Mug Shots, Packet Noodles and Washing Powder tabs, and there is always a need for Fruit juice (not grapefruit), Biscuits, Jelly Pots, Microwaveable Rice, the smaller child-sized cartons of fruit juice, Cup-a-Soups, Fruit Squash, Boxes of Breakfast Cereal, UHT Milk, Tinned fruit, Tinned spaghetti, Tinned rice pudding, Individual packets of powdered custard, Jam & Tinned vegetables.
