- Refugee support Afghan refugees: at the time of writing, both West Northamptonshire Council and North Northamptonshire Council have said that they will provide support to Afghan refugees coming to the county, with the former speaking in terms of providing initial accommodation and care and support for up to 140 people; and there are likely to be ways in which individuals and community groups can provide support in the coming weeks and months, building on the existing work and plans of refugee support groups in Kettering, Wellingborough, Northampton and East Northants.

This is due to be discussed at the next meeting of Friends of Refugees – East Northants (7.30pm on Thursday 14th October, probably on Zoom). Information will also be circulated before then as it emerges.

News from the Daylight Centre (3rd Sep)

The numbers of food parcels going out from the Centre are now starting to increase again. Help from the supermarkets has diminished as the supply chain is disrupted by the lack of HGV drivers. Therefore our help is still needed. Support for families is still needed as are the packs for the homeless. Work continues at the Daylight Centre itself which is also getting busier offering appointments for assistance with benefits, housing and medical issues.

Stocks are now running low on: Pot Noodles. Tinned vegetables, Weetabix (or similar breakfast biscuit), Fruit juice (not grapefruit) and Kitchen Roll and there is always a need for UHT Whole Milk (not semi-skimmed), the smaller child-sized cartons of fruit juice, Sugar, Coffee, Biscuits, Crackers (savoury biscuits), Washing Powder tabs, Microwaveable Rice, Packets of rice (basmati, wholegrain etc), Boilin-the-Bag Rice, Jelly (in cubes or already made up in pots), Custard (packets, tins or boxes), Tinned rice pudding, Instant Whip Desserts,), Jam, Tinned Fruit, Toilet Rolls, Fruit Squash, Boxes of Breakfast Cereal, Mug Shots, Cup-a- Soups, Pasta Pots, Packet Noodles, Tinned spaghetti, Tinned Potatoes, Small Tins of fish (sardines, tuna etc), Tins of meat (eg Stewing Steak, Meat Curry, Minced Beef etc) including Fray Bentos Tinned Pies, Spray Deodorant for ladies and men, and cheap tin openers (for the homeless).
