Luidmila (Mila) Kuchma is organising aid going out through Hope Church Wellingborough and Elim Church. We know the family (of husband Vladimir & 5 children) and friend Anton (who is a Pastor) and his wife, through fellowship at Hope Church. I think it was last year they all returned to the Ukraine before making a miraculous escape back to the UK. Presently they are in need of the following items:-

Non- Perishable food, Medicines, Warm Clothes, Shoes, Socks, Baby Food, Nappies, Underwear

They have also set up a GoFundMe page <http://gofund.me/c91a9a50> which has only just been activated through Ignite Elim Church, for anyone wishing to make a monetary donation either feeding into or called Helping Hand Ukraine.

Crafted Prayers for 2022 - Over the next few weeks a number of prayers will be published for our use. These have come from the Sunday evening 'worship, prayer & prophetic' equipping evenings. The second one is around the theme of 'New people, new ventures':

Bishop Donald has released a series of recorded talks which can be accessed on the [diocesan website](https://www.peterborough-diocese.org.uk). He suggests that they may be used as a five week Lent study course, the first week looking at talks 1 and 6, then one week each of the Gospel talks. Or as a replacement for the Bible Day, possibly on the originally planned date of Sunday 5 March, that they are watched in order, on your own or with others. The talks are:

- 15 minute introduction to the Gospels
- half-hour talk on each of the four Gospel books
- 15 minute talk on the reliability of the Gospels.

On Sat 12 March we hope you will join us live online for a morning of worship, two workshops and the opportunity to quiz the Bishop.

This event is for anyone who uses the Bible in their ministry, in church, in school, at work, in the community or at home.

News from the Daylight Centre (4th March)

Numbers are still increasing at the Food Bank and they anticipate a greater demand on their services once the energy price rises kick in. There are currently over 100 parcels per week being delivered to those in food poverty. Thank you to everyone who supports the Daylight Centre Food Bank. All your donations are very much appreciated. Thank you.

Stocks are now running low on: *Tinned Fruit, Fruit Squash, Toilet Paper, Cup-a-Soups, Mug Shots, Pot Noodles, Pasta & Sauce and Tinned Custard.* There is always a need for *Sugar, Biscuits, Crackers (savory biscuits), Crisps, Washing Powder tabs, Tinned rice pudding, Fruit juice (not grapefruit), the smaller child-sized cartons of fruit juice, Coffee (100gm jars), Jam, Packets of rice (basmati, wholegrain etc), Savoury Rice, Boil-in-the-Bag Rice, Microwaveable Rice, Jelly (in cubes or already made up in pots), Boxes of Breakfast Cereal, Weetabix (or similar breakfast biscuit), Pasta, Pasta Pots, Packet Noodles, Tinned spaghetti, UHT Whole Milk & Semi-skimmed Milk, Tinned Potatoes, Tinned vegetables, Tinned pulses (butter beans, kidney beans etc), Small Tins of fish (sardines, tuna etc), Tins of meat (eg Stewing Steak, Meat Curry, Minced Beef etc) including Fray Bentos Tinned Pies, Instant Whip Desserts and Kitchen Roll.* Nappies in size 5 and size 6 (no need for expensive ones) are also helpful at present. Also *Spray Deodorant for ladies and men, Dog food, and cheap tin openers (for the homeless) are also always welcome.* Thank you

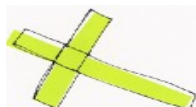

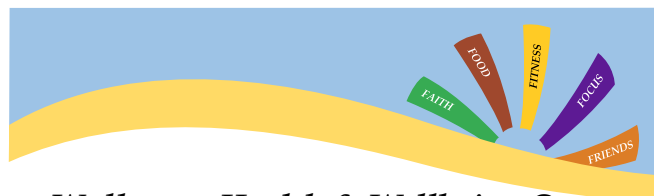
